





Remembrance Sunday Act of Remembrance



Frome War Memorial
Sunday, 12th November 2023
at 10.45 for 10.55hrs

This year we mark 160 years of the work of the ICRC (International Committee of the Red Cross, and the parallel Red Crescent Movement) In October 1863 an international conference was convened which agreed on a standard emblem to identify medical personnel on the battlefield: a red cross on a white background.









From the early vision of Henry Dunant, one of the first winners of the Nobel peace prize, the ICRC's work has expanded and remains vital to this day.

We mark 80 years since the invasions of Sicily and Italy during WW2.

We recall the loss on 14 March 1943 off Sicily of HM submarine Thunderbolt, adopted by the town of Frome, and the subsequent adoption of the destroyer HMS Montrose.

We will rededicate a plaque including the previously omitted name of Robert William Smith who died as a result of his service in WW2. This addition brings comfort and conclusion to members of his family, some of whom are present here today.

We mark 70 years since the armistice ending open hostilities in the Korean War.

We hold in thought and prayer the places of the world currently broken and damaged by conflict and the many innocent victims of those conflicts.

We mark the last official duty, before retirement, of our Town Crier, Mike Bishop, who has supported for many years this memorable and worthwhile cause.
